The Wicks' waterways form a key part of the Mayor of London's biodiversity strategy



Hackney Wicks' waterways served as a transport link for thousands of years and acted as trade veins during the peak industrial era as well as during the Olympics, connecting Hackney Wick to the rest of London and the home counties.

Today, the canals are popular with everyone from business owners who sell books from a barge, to people who prefer to pedal their bicycles along the miles of paths. Hertford Union Canal and River Lea Navigation pass north and east of The Wick, whilst Regent's Canal provides gets you from east to west, all the way from Limehouse to Paddington via Angel.
